## Uncomfortable

Honestly, I don't like to be uncomfortable. I bet that you don't either. We live in a culture of convenience and comfort. We don't like being too cold or too hot. We don't like being sick. We don't like being inconvenienced. We don't like engaging in uncomfortable conversations. We don't like having to do someone else's work. We don't like having to go too much out of our way for anything. Perhaps that's why I've never been comfortable with passages like: **John 15:20**: “If they persecuted me, they will persecute you also” or **James 1:2**: “Consider it pure joy, my brothers, whenever you face trials of many kinds” or **Romans 5:3**: “we also rejoice in our sufferings” or **John 16:33**: “In this world you will have trouble. . .” Rejoice over my suffering – what???

This week, two things have given me a new (or maybe renewed) perspective on how God often works in our lives – especially through hardships. First, throughout the week, I've been receiving interesting and inspiring reports from our mission team in New York. Second, this week's lesson in our **God Provides** Bible study reminded me one of God's greatest promises about hope (Jer. 29:11). Some of you will probably hear this story when the mission team gives its report, but I still want to share it with all of you. Our mission team drove in a cramped van thirteen hours to get to Jamaica, New York. Their lodging consists of truck trailers that have been converted into bunk houses. Because of the cold weather, there is no running water in the bathroom. Because some of the heaters were broken, the bunk trailers stayed cold. In fact, their lodging was so cold and uncomfortable that, during their free time, they sought refuge and warmth in the closest establishment, which happened to be a bar. While there, they began to explain to their waitress why they were there (in New York, and in the bar). The conversation naturally transitioned to Christ, and soon they had led this young lady to a personal relationship with Jesus. One of the team members put the pieces together. Had they not been cold, they wouldn't have gone into the bar. Had they not gone into the bar, they wouldn't have had the conversation with the waitress. Had they not had the conversation with the waitress, she may have never heard the Gospel and been saved. So, amazingly, God worked out their uncomfortable situation for good. Then, believe it or not, when they got back to their trailer, a new heater had been added and the bunk house was toasty warm.

Perhaps that's exactly what God meant for us to understand when He gave us Bible verses like: **Romans 8:28**: “And we know that in all things God works for the good of those who love him, who have been called according to his purpose” and **Jeremiah 29:11**: “‘For I know the plans I have for you,’ declares the LORD, ‘plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future’” and **2 Corinthians 4:17**: “For our light and momentary troubles are achieving for us an eternal glory that far outweighs them all.”

So the next time you find yourself in an uncomfortable situation, look around for what God may be doing. It just may be an opportunity for you to share your faith or to see just how great and purposeful God is. Thank you Mission Team. Remember: Jesus Loves You And So Do I! Pastor Jimmy
