Is the Bible the Plumb-line of Your Life?

Is the Bible the plumb-line of your life – the standard by which you base all of your thoughts, feelings, attitudes, convictions, priorities, commitments, words, actions, responses, and lifestyle? God has made it clear that He did not mean for the Bible to just be a great piece of literature for us to admire and to keep on our shelves. No, God gave us the Bible to be our guidebook for living. We must understand and believe that, as our divine guidebook, the Bible is true, trustworthy, and authoritative. Indeed, if you do not believe that, then you will not believe its narratives, you will not trust its truths, and you will not submit to its commands.

Our doctrinal confession on Scriptures from the 1963 *Baptist Faith and Message* states: “*The Holy Bible was written by men divinely inspired and is the record of Gods revelation of Himself to man. It is a perfect treasure of divine instruction. It has God for its author, salvation for its end, and truth, without any mixture of error, for its matter. It reveals the principles by which God judges us; and therefore is, and will remain to the end of the world, the true center of Christian union, and the supreme standard by which all human conduct, creeds, and religious opinions should be tried. The criterion by which the Bible is to be interpreted is Jesus Christ.*”

An unknown writer said of the Bible, “*This Book is the mind of God, the state of man, the way of salvation, the doom of sinners, and the happiness of believers. Its doctrines are holy, its precepts are binding; its histories are true, and its decisions are immutable. Read it to be wise, believe it to be safe, practice it to be holy. It contains light to direct you, food to support you, and comfort to cheer you. It is the traveler’s map, the pilgrim’s staff, the pilot’s compass, the soldier’s sword, and the Christian’s character. Here paradise is restored, heaven opened, and the gates of hell disclosed. Christ is its grand subject, our good its design, and the glory of God its end. It should fill the memory, rule the heart, and guide the feet. Read it slowly, frequently, prayerfully. It is a mine of wealth, a paradise of glory, and a river of pleasure. Follow its precepts and it will lead you to Calvary, to the empty tomb, to a resurrected life in Christ; yes, to glory itself, for eternity*” (found at sermonillustrations.com).

Let’s consider some Scripture passages that confirm the importance of God’s Word for our lives. King David declared: “*The law of the LORD is perfect, refreshing the soul. The statutes of the LORD are trustworthy, making wise the simple. The precepts of the LORD are right, giving joy to the heart. The commands of the LORD are radiant, giving light to the eyes. The fear of the LORD is pure, enduring forever. The decrees of the LORD are firm, and all of them are righteous. They are more precious than gold, than much pure gold; they are sweeter than honey, than honey from the honeycomb. By them your servant is warned; in keeping them there is great reward*” (Ps 19:7-11). God spoke these words through the Prophet Isaiah: “*As the rain and the snow come down from heaven, and do not return to it without watering the earth and making it bud and*
