WHERE DO WE STAND

1. Monthly Budget \$23,846. YTD Budget \$214,615.
2. September 2016 general fund offerings \$17,547. YTD offerings \$193,683.
3. September offerings were 35.0% below September's budget. YTD offerings 89.19% of budget.
4. Unrestricted cash on hand as of September 30 was \$68,609 (August balance was \$76,829).
5. Account 5115 CBFNC Mission Resource Plan (our church 10% tithe) paid for September.
6. Designated fund offering for September were \$7,687. YTD designated offerings \$32,801. Designated fund balance \$111,366.
7. The sealing and painting of the education building was completed in September. This expense was \$9,999 and was paid from the Sales Tax refund account, as well as the insurance savings account.
8. Account 5420 – Properties- O'Brien Service - \$1,612 (warranty compressor, voltage switch, float switch on the AC's); Gutters for Educational Building and Church – \$2,966
