Do You Know What You Believe?

Does it really matter what you believe? The Bible suggests that God wants His followers to know what we believe, why we believe it, and be able to share it with others. God wants us to live by a biblical worldview. Our church subscribes to the 1963 *Baptist Faith and Message*, which summarizes 18 major doctrines. To assist you in learning and abiding by a biblical worldview, each month we are highlighting various sections of our doctrinal statement. This month we will highlight the doctrines of the Christian and the Social Order and Peace and War.

THE CHRISTIAN AND THE SOCIAL ORDER: Every Christian is under obligation to seek to make the will of Christ supreme in his own life and in human society. Means and methods used for the improvement of society and the establishment of righteousness among men can be truly and permanently helpful only when they are rooted in the regeneration of the individual by the saving grace of God in Christ Jesus. The Christian should oppose in the spirit of Christ every form of greed, selfishness, and vice. He should work to provide for the orphaned, the needy, the aged, the helpless, and the sick. Every Christian should seek to bring industry, government, and society as a whole under the sway of the principles of righteousness, truth, and brotherly love. In order to promote these ends Christians should be ready to work with all men of good will in any good cause, always being careful to act in the spirit of love without compromising their loyalty to Christ and His truth. (Ex 20:3-17; Lev 6:2-5; Deut 10:12; 27:17; Ps 101:5; Mic 6:8; Zech 8:16; Mt 5:13-16, 43-48; 22:36-40; 25:35; Mk 1:29-34, 2:3; 10:21; Lk 4:18-21; 10:27-37; 20:25; Jn 15:12; 17:15; Rom 12-14; 1Cor 5:9-10; 6:1-7; 7:20-24; 10:23-11:1; Gal 3:26-28; Eph 6:5-9; Col 3:12-17; 1Thes 3:12; Phm 1:1-25; Jms 1:27; 2:8)

PEACE AND WAR: It is the duty of Christians to seek peace with all men on principles of righteousness. In accordance with the spirit and teachings of Christ they should do all in their power to put an end to war. The true remedy for the war spirit is the gospel of our Lord. The supreme need of the world is the acceptance of His teachings in all the affairs of men and nations, and the practical application of His law of love. (Is 2:4; Mt 5:9, 38-48; 6:33; 26:52; Lk 22:36,38; Rom 12:18-19; 13:1-7; 14:19; Heb 12:14; Jms 4:1-2)
